

The reception was followed on Wednesday, September 19th, by a full day of workshops and educational sessions presented by industry leaders who shared their knowledge and experiences.


The day began with a full breakfast followed by The Women in HVACR President- Patti Ellingson sharing details of the year's success with educational

She had us work in groups to define effective communication. We then discussed the elements of the communication process.

We then were asked to determine the barriers to communication we experienced in this exercise. Nita then spoke about the best communication approach.

Protecting Your Privacy in 2013 Beware of Phishing

Phishing is a scam that attempts to lure you into providing personal information so that it can be used to steal your identity. If you receive a phone call that seems suspicious, hang up and call the company back using a telephone number you have for them—NOT a number the caller gives you—to check whether it is a legitimate inquiry. If an email looks suspicious or is from an unknown source, do not click on any links, provide any information, or open any attachments.

Beware of Emails That:

- Require personal and confidential information, including SSN, account number(s), login ID numbers, etc.
 - Threaten to close or suspend your account(s).
- State your account has been compromised and you need to confirm your information.
 - Ask you to enter an account access code or personal password.


What to Do If You are a Victim:

- Change your Account Access password from an uninfected PC.
- Ensure that you have a current firewall, anti-virus software, and spyware detection software installed on your PC.
- Run a virus scan on your PC and clean up any viruses or trojans that are detected.
